

Let's try this again!

Beginning this Sunday, October 24, the following guidelines for worship will be in effect:

- Those who have been vaccinated for Covid-19 no longer need to wear a mask. However, you may keep wearing a mask if you wish.
- The seating in the front of the sanctuary will be unrestricted. If you have been vaccinated, you may sit in the unmarked pews without social distancing. Please reserve the pews in the back of the sanctuary for those who wish to maintain social distancing. If you choose to sit in the socially distant pews, you will be asked to wear a mask.
- We will begin congregational singing! Hymns and bibles will be placed in the pews, but the words to the hymns will also be in the bulletin.
- The HVAC system will be kept running during the service. This will increase airflow but will also increase background noise and may make it a bit cooler than you are used to, so please plan appropriately.
- We will continue the practice of not passing offering plates or communion plates for the time being. The offering plates will be placed in the narthex for people to place their gifts and communion will continue to be prepackaged.
- Church committees and ministries can meet in the church without needing prior authorization from Session. Outside groups will be evaluated on a case-by-case basis.

The Story of Waverly Road Presbyterian Church—The 80's, (Part 2 taken from Be Thou My Vision by Keene White)

On April 25, 1982 David C. Kennedy was called to become our Senior Pastor. David, his wife Margaret, and their children Beth, 17 and Mike, 14, would be moving to Kingsport prior to July 13th. Pastor Kennedy was installed on Sunday afternoon, August 1st.

On Thanksgiving Day 1982 a joint worship service with Mafair Methodist and St. Dominic's Churches was held in our sanctuary. On January 1, 1983 Pat Earnest, who had served so faithfully as Director of the Child Care and as Choir Director, resigned both positions in order to accept other employment. Pat's dedication was recognized at a church night supper in December and she was appropriately honored.

At the 1982 General Assemblies of the two major branches of the Presbyterian family, approval was given

to a proposed plan of union, although "reunion" is the more appropriate word and the plan sent to the Presbyteries of both denominations. On February 12, 1983 the two Holston Presbyteries met at Kingsport's First Church to debate and vote on the proposal. The Moderator of our Holston Presbytery was Ruling Elder Doris Carson, a member of Waverly Road Church and the first woman to serve the presbytery as Moderator. After lunch the Presbyteries met separately and then rejoined to announce the results. After the announcements that both Presbyteries had voted affirmatively the floor was given to those who wished to speak. Some of the most eloquent pledges of goodwill and high intentions were spoken by those who voiced opposition earlier that day. The two Presbyteries joined in prayer and in a hymn that was sung with such power and emotion as to have been heard for blocks away.

What is the Flu Shot?, cont'd.

inactivated, so they can't infect you. Your immune system recognizes those inactive viruses as invaders, though, and creates antibodies to destroy similar-looking active virus cells if they appear in your body again.

Because the flu comes in many different varieties, the most common flu shot in the U.S. protects you against four strains of influenza. Some flu shots also contain ingredients called adjuvants that create a stronger immune response, and flu shots for people over age 65 come in a high dose version to stimulate the immune system even more.

The flu shot usually is given by injection into the upper arm. It's a quick, relatively painless procedure. Pro tip: Shake out and dangle your arm to relax it before and during the shot, and then keep your arm moving all day to minimize discomfort.

And if you just can't stand the thought of an injection, ask about getting the mist-based version of the flu "shot" instead. A health care professional will spray this mist up your nostrils -- BOOM! You're vaccinated. That said, the flu mist may not be as easy to find as the flu shot. Call ahead to find out if your doctor's office or clinic offers it.

Some people should talk to their doctors before getting a flu shot. For example, people with a severe gelatin allergy or those with a history of Guillain-Barre syndrome might be advised to avoid the influenza vaccine. Your doctor can give you specific advice. This year, in particular, it's vital that everyone who can get a flu shot get one because you become much more susceptible to COVID-19 if you are sick with the flu. And getting sick with both influenza and COVID-19 at the same time could be deadly. So do yourself a favor by getting your flu shot as soon as possible.
