
The Story of Waverly Road Presbyterian Church (Continuing our Church History 2021)

In January of 2021, Julie Vogel, our director of music ministries for 35 years retired. Because Covid restricted us from having any in-person celebrations a special book of memories and a virtual "kudos" board was made for Julie with contributions from choir members and the congregation to recognize the



faithful service to God that her ministry with WRPC was.

Richard Brown stepped in as interim for Julie while we searched for a permanent Director of Music Ministry.



Services over the holidays were live streamed, but in February the Session committee met (online via Zoom) to discuss the worship committee's motion to reinstate in-person services. The drop in Covid case numbers allowed worship to resume with precautions such as a mask requirement, social

distancing and limited seating, singing only by a small choral group in the choir loft, and no hymnals or shared elements (pre-packaged elements for communion were provided). When Julie retired, thus did Ernie who primarily ran the sound board for many, many years. The new online streaming platforms like YouTube and Facebook where we posted live worship content had its hiccups with some initial sound and feedback issues. The sound system was inspected and later updated to keep up with the new demands of streaming.

To keep in touch with our members during these unprecedented times, online Zoom game nights replaced Feasts of Fellowship this year. A LET - Love and

A socially distanced egg hunt was held and very well received! Each family had a scheduled time to hunt their eggs.

Totally 80's at-home VBS in July was a huge success too, with a kick-off in a rented movie theater so we could socially distance while watching an 80's movie, activities and games at home, and an outdoor pool party to end the weekend!

On June 14, 2021 we welcomed Kate Stubbs as our Director of Music Ministry. She jumped right into the job successfully navigating Covidsafety requirements, virtual streaming, outdoor, and regular in-person choir!

SA-48-21: The following motion was made and seconded:

The Session has been in prayer and discussion over the pandemic resurgence in our local area, and how best to respond. WRPC is a congregation whose mission is first and foremost to Love God and Love One Another, as our Savior taught us. With humility, to do all we can to protect the most vulnerable in our community, WRPC will be returning to virtual worship services only through Sunday, Sept. 19. At that time, the Session will reassess the local data and CDC guidance. During this period masks will be required in the Church building during the week, and for those recording the virtual services on Sunday, with the exception of individuals speaking at the pulpit. These actions are consistent with previous actions we have taken during times of high community spread.

We don't take these actions lightly, and are praying fervently that this is a temporary situation. Please be in prayer for our church, our community, for our health care workers, and all who are being impacted by the pandemic.

"One of the scribes came near and heard them disputing with one another, and seeing that he answered them well, he asked him, "Which commandment is the first of all?" Jesus answered, "The first is, 'Hear, O Israel: the Lord our God, the Lord is one; you shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your mind, and with all your strength. Motion carried unanimously. The motion will be shared with the Congregation and Staff ASAP. Note: After the meeting, Susan Lodal and Diana Eldredge expressed support for the motion via

Over both 2020 and 2021, protocols were changed, adjusted, canceled, and re-instated many, many times. Covid numbers spiked again with a new strain surging in August 2021 and plans to return to more normal activities were once again delayed. Services returned to virtual that month and Sunday Schools remained via Zoom.

Family Promise for 2020 and 2021 housed families in hotels, with the WRPC mission committee supporting the mission with additional funds for the cost of rooms and meals for weeks we are scheduled to host.

In October in-person services resumed with a mask requirement, with precautions returning in November to the measurements taken before the Delta outbreak which made mask wearing optional, except in the special social distancing and mask wearing section. Congregational singing began again, and choir members could choose to

not wear a mask in the chancel. Due to vaccinations not being available yet for all children under 12, Sunday School remained via Zoom. Advent and Christmas offered both in -person and streaming services and a small Christmas pageant play was performed in the Fellowship Hall in early December.

Mission Moment Update...

Report on Snacks for Cora Cox Academy May 1, 2022

Good morning. My message to you from the Mission Committee this morning is, "Thank you, thank you!"

We offered opportunities for you to participate in two service projects during our recent Season of Mission ~ Season of Hope.

I am reporting on your donations of snacks for the students at Cora Cox Academy, an alternative education program of Kingsport City Schools. Karen Carman will provide an update soon on donations of Hygiene Kits for Grace House.

First Presbyterian Church provides snacks for Cora Cox Academy as an ongoing project of their Outreach Committee. We joined up with them in February and March to provide specific items that staff members identified as the most requested snacks.

Some of you donated \$100 towards this project and it was used to help purchase some of the food. Thank you.

Between the donations of funds and the donations of food, this is what we delivered:

- 53 individual servings of pasta
- 66 individual servings of macaroni & cheese
- 68 bottles of sports drinks
- 111 individual servings of Ramen Noodles and other soups
- 244 individual packages of fruit snacks

Including other assorted food donations, we delivered a total of 615 snack items to Cora Cox Academy at the end of March.

Students are already benefiting from your gifts of food during the school day and if anything should remain at the end of the school year later this month, which is highly unlikely, it will be available to students attending summer school.

Creamy Strawberry Dessert Squares

Yield: 20 servings

Ingredients

Crust:

1 (17.5 ounce) pouch sugar cookie mix

½ cup butter, softened

1 egg

Filling:

1 (8 ounce) package cream cheese, softened

1 (8 ounce) container frozen whipped topping

Topping:

1/3 cup white sugar

2 tablespoons cornstarch

4 cups sliced fresh strawberries, divided

1/3 cup water

1 teaspoon vanilla extract

1 dash red food coloring, or desired amount

Directions

- 1. Preheat oven to 350 degrees F (175 degrees C). Spray the inside bottom of a jelly roll pan with cooking spray.
- 2. Mix sugar cookie mix, butter, and egg together in a large bowl until a soft dough forms; press evenly into prepared pan.
- 3. Bake in the preheated oven until crust is light golden brown, 10 to 15 minutes. Cool completely, about 30 minutes.
- 4. Beat cream cheese using an electric mixer on medium speed in a bowl until smooth. Add whipped topping and stir until smooth; spread over crust. Refrigerate.
- 5. Mix sugar and cornstarch together in a 2-quart saucepan; add 1 cup strawberries, water, and vanilla extract. Cook and stir strawberry mixture, mashing strawberries with spoon while cooking, over medium heat until strawberries are softened and mixture is thickened, 10 to 15 minutes.
- 6. Stir food coloring into strawberry mixture and remove from heat; cool for 10 minutes. Gently stir remaining 3 cups strawberries into strawberry mixture; spoon over cream cheese filling. Refrigerate until set, about 1 hour. Serve within 4 hours.
