When we gather with friends and family at Christmas, we celebrate the many gifts that we have both given and received. Looking

toward the Star of Bethlehem, we give thanks for the blessings of the past year and anticipate a future filled with hope and possibility. We live in hope that the Christmas gift we offer is exactly what that special person has been hoping for. Yet for those of us celebrating Advent's expectation, we know that the only perfect gift ever given is the one we receive in Jesus Christ.

On Sunday, December 11 we will take up the final PCUSA special offering of the year, the Christmas Joy Offering. Through the Christmas Joy Offering, we reflect God's perfect gift to us, with generous support of church leaders among us – past, present and future – who have pointed us to God.
