**2023 Habitat Faith Build** 



One of Waverly Road's missions is Holston Habitat for Humanity that seeks to put God's love into action by

building homes, communities, and hope. It is part of a global, non-profit housing organization operated on Christian principles.

This spring, several Kingsport churches, including Waverly Road, will join in the 2023 Habitat Faith Build. They will partner with Marquetta and her three children in building a new house on Friendship Circle (near the previous Faith Builds). Groundbreaking ceremony will be April 14.


The Faith Build schedule allows several churches, along with Habitat Regulars, to share in the overall construction effort. Waverly Road volunteers will work on Thursday, Friday, and Saturday, July 27-29. Planned tasks will include installing cabinets, closets, bathroom fixtures, and trim.



## Hymn Stories Hosanna, Loud Hosanna

This hymn was written by Jennette Threfall a century and a half ago. If you had known Jennette, you might have pitied her, because as a child she was orphaned and as an adult she suffered an accident that rendered her an invalid. But the people around her knew her, not for her handicap, but for her cheerful nature. She was a woman of deep faith who expressed that faith through her poetry. In her song, "Hosanna, Loud Hosanna," she invites us to celebrate again the coming of Jesus into Jerusalem in his Triumphal Entry. — Richard Niell Donovan, *sermonwriter.com* 

## **Ride On! Ride On In Majesty!**

"Ride On, Ride On in Majesty!" is a Christian hymn written by Henry Hart Milman in 1820. It is a Palm Sunday hymn and refers to Matthew 21:1–17 and Jesus' triumphal entry into Jerusalem.

While Milman wrote "Ride On, Ride On in Majesty!" in 1820, it was not published in a hymn book until 1827 when it was published in Bishop Reginald Heber's Hymns written and adapted to the Weekly Church Service of the Year. This is reported to only have happened after Milman met Heber in 1823 before Heber became Bishop of Calcutta. It was described by composer Stanley L. Osbourne as "Objective, robust, confident, and stirring. It possesses that peculiar combination of tragedy and victory which draws the singer into the very center of the drama. It is this which gives the hymn its power and its challenge". The hymn proved to be very popular in 1907. John Julian, in his Dictionary of Hymnology, stated it was the most popular Palm Sunday hymn in the English language at that time.

The hymn is viewed to be full of dramatic irony. The third line of the first verse "Thine humble beast pursues his road" has been disliked by some hymn book editors. In 1852 it was changed to "O Saviour meek, pursue Thy road" and in 1855 to "With joyous throngs pursue Thy road". Some hymn books have omitted the first verse. The unaltered original text, however appears in later collections such as the 1906 English Hymnal, and in some modern hymnals. The hymn is used as a processional hymn during Palm Sunday. – *Wikipedia*

## A Recipe for Easter Resurrection Rolls

Looking for a fun and memorable way to tell your kids the story of Jesus' burial and resurrection? This Resurrection Roll recipe is deliciously simple, and it brings with it



the ultimate meaning of Easter Sunday.

#### Ingredients

- 16 large marshmallows
- 1/2 cup butter, melted
- 1/4 cup sugar
- 2 tablespoons cinnamon
- 2 (8-oz.) cans crescent roll dough

#### Directions

- 1. Combine sugar and cinnamon in a small bowl.
- 2. Unroll crescent roll dough, and separate each roll along perforations.

- 3. Roll marshmallows in melted butter, and then in cinnamon-sugar mixture. Place one coated marshmallow in the middle of an unrolled crescent dough segment, and roll the marshmallow until completely covered by the dough, pushing in sides as you go. Pinch seams on either end to seal each roll.
- 4. Place rolls on a jellyroll pan, and bake at 350° for about 12 minutes.
- 5. Immediately after removing rolls from the oven, brush with remaining melted butter and then sprinkle with remaining cinnamon-sugar mixture. Serve warm.
