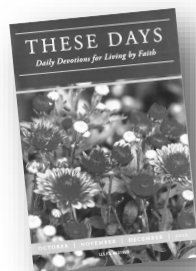
Youth Group begins in September!

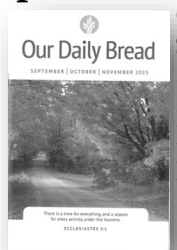
