Loving Each Other

Dear Fellow Waverly Roaders,

Your Fellowship & Discipleship and Congregational Care Committees are working to get our time of fellowship and meal sharing, formerly known

as WOW (Waverly on Wednesday) up and going again after a 3-year hiatus due to the COVID pandemic and related changes in church demographics and dynamics. The 3-year work of the Adult Learning and Discipleship Committee from 2019-2021 came to the following conclusions: (1) the primary goal of Discipleship is to learn to follow Jesus and "live in communion" as a congregation of people who love each other (as described in Acts 2:42-47); (2) to do so first requires Fellowship, as love first requires relationship.

Historically, programs like WOW have been viewed as a "gift" from the church to the congregation. A committee (*Continued on back*)

and a few volunteers took responsibility to consistently provide an opportunity for the congregation to gather and enjoy fellowship together. As our church has changed in the past few years (pandemic effects, shrinking congregation, shrinking budgets, etc.), we believe we have lost the "critical mass" of volunteers to continue with such perspective.

We are therefore proposing a new program of "Loving" Each Other (LEO) Meals," on selected Sundays after Worship. The idea is that individuals and/or families who have a desire (a "calling," or "passion") to do so, may offer their time, energy, and love to plan, prepare, and serve a meal as their "gift" to their brothers and sisters in the congregation, on a Sunday of their choosing (that does not interfere with other activities already on the church calendar). They may recruit others to help, as needed, for planning, cooking (if needed), serving, and cleaning afterward. They may choose to cook (in the church kitchen or at home and bring to the church), to plan and coordinate catering, to invite a food truck, to bring sandwiches, chips, and drinks, a bowl of soup and slice of bread, or whatever other method they are most comfortable with to provide a simple meal to their brothers and sisters following Worship. The F&D Committee will reimburse expenses for anyone unable to donate their costs in addition to their time, energy, and love. Our committees will also help in any way possible to make the experience fulfilling and meaningful for everyone involved. There will be no "regular" scheduling of LEO meals. They will occur when those "called" are available and willing to provide them. Nursery workers will be available for young children.

If you are interested and willing to participate in this new effort, either as a "LEO Leader" (responsible for a meal), or as a "LEO Assistant" (willing to help LEO Leaders when possible), please contact Howard Carman, Linda Qualls, or Amy Boyles. Guidelines will be provided for LEO Leaders, describing what will be needed and how to obtain information, assistance, or resources for helping provide your "gift."

Each LEO meal will include an informal program of table discussions prompted by questions from "Talking Points for Christians" (a card deck of questions for faith-based conversations for any comfort or knowledge level).

The first LEO meal will take place on October 15, 2023 (Pledge Sunday), in the Fellowship Hall following Worship. This gift will be provided by Linda Qualls (and her team of helpers, including Cindy Slayer, Conner Caldwell, and Howard Carman). Please plan to attend if you are able. And stay tuned for news of other LEO events, hopefully in the very near future.
