


December 17–23, 2023

Cranberry Noel Cookies

These cookies are sweet little shortbread cookies with a touch of tart cranberry and nutty pecans. You could also substitute the cranberries with dried cherries.

Ingredients

2 sticks (1 cup) unsalted butter

1/2 cup sugar

1/2 cup powdered sugar

2 Tbsp. milk

2 tsp. vanilla extract

21/4 cups all-purpose flour

1/2 tsp. salt

3/4 cup dried cranberries, chopped

1/2 cup pecans, chopped

1/2 cup shredded coconut (optional)

Directions

- 1. In the bowl of a stand mixer fitted with the paddle attachment, cream the butter and sugars until light and fluffy, about 5 minutes. Mix in the milk and vanilla extract.
- Gradually mix the flour and salt into the butter mixture until a soft dough forms. Fold in the dried cranberries and pecans.
- Transfer the dough onto a countertop sprinkled with flour. Divide the dough in two. Roll each section of dough into a smooth log, about 2-inches in diameter. Roll in shredded coconut, if using. Wrap each log in plastic wrap and chill the dough for two hours.
- 4. Preheat the oven to 375°F, and line a baking sheet with parchment paper. Remove the dough from the fridge, and take off the plastic wrap. Use a sharp knife to slice the logs into 1/4-inch slices, and place each slice on the prepared baking sheet.
- Bake the cookies for 14 minutes until the edges are lightly golden brown. Remove the cookies from the oven, and let cool on the baking sheet for 5 minutes before transferring to wire racks to finish cooling.
