This is the time of year, the Season of Advent, when so many things warm our hearts ... being with our friends and families, the faces

of children, the carols we love to sing together, the anticipation of sharing gifts. And we love the lights — the lights on the trees, the candles in the windows — and yes, the Star of Bethlehem, which reminds us of the light that led the way to the perfect gift. Bundt Pan Cornbread

Requested recipe from Bree Fox


Ingredients:

- 1 ½ cups self-rising white corn meal
- 1 ½ cups self-rising flour
- 2 eggs
- 1 tbsp vegetable oil
- 1 tbsp sugar
- $2\frac{1}{4}$ to $2\frac{1}{2}$ cups buttermilk
- 1 stick butter

Directions:

- 1. Preheat oven to 450 degrees. Place a stick of butter in a bundt pan, and put it in the oven as you preheat the oven or about 5-6 minutes before you're ready to pour in the batter. Melt butter completely in the pan.
- 2. Mix together the corn meal and flour in a medium bowl. Add in eggs, vegetable oil, and sugar, and mix. Add in buttermilk and stir. The batter should

- drip off the spoon fairly easily as you raise it. If it doesn't, add more buttermilk by the tablespoon full until it does.
- 3. Remove bundt pan from oven, pour in batter. (The butter will mix in with the batter and become part of it yum! Don't stir in the butter.)
- 4. Bake for 35-40 minutes, until golden brown. Tip out onto a plate as soon as you remove it from the oven. Slice and enjoy!
