

#### **The Good Samaritan**

Together the Godly Play Lessons form a spiral curriculum that enables



children to move into adolescence with an inner working knowledge of the classical Christian language system to sustain them all of their lives. The parable box is golden with something valuable

inside, do not be discouraged if you do not understand the parable. Just keep coming back to it again and again. Parables are gifts given to you long ago.

There was once someone who did such amazing things and said such wonderful things that people followed him. As they followed him they heard him speak of many things and sometimes people asked them questions.

One day someone asked, "What is the most important thing in life?" Jesus said, "You already know." "This is true. I do. It is to love God and to love, people just like they are your neighbors. But who is my neighbor?"

Jesus answered with this parable, "There was someone who went from Jerusalem down to Jericho. As he went along his way he was attacked by robbers. They hurt him and took everything he had and left him beside the road half dead. There was also a great Priest of the temple who went on the road from Jerusalem to Jericho. As he went along his way, he came to the place where the person who

had been hurt, had everything taken from him, and had been left by the side of the road half dead. When the Priest came to him, the priest went to the other side of the road and went along his way.

There was also someone else who worked at the temple who went along the road from Jerusalem to Jericho. He was one of the people who helped the Priests. He took care of the temple and helped with the music. He was called a Levite. When the Levite came to the place where the person who was hurt, had everything taken from him, and had been left by the side of the road half dead, he went to the other side, and he went along his way.

There was also a person who went on the road; who did not live in Jerusalem. He was visiting from a country called Samaria. The people in Samaria did not like people in Jerusalem. The people of Jerusalem did not like the people of Samaria. When the stranger came to the place where the person had been hurt, had everything taken from him and had been left by the side of the road half dead, THE STRANGER CAME TO HIM.

Now I wonder, what would happen if the people in the parable were women and not men? What if the person finding the injured traveler were a child?

The wondering questions do not normally have a right or wrong answer. They are just used to help the child think deeper. A lot of time is not spent with the wondering questions unless the children begin a discussion.

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## A Recipe for Lent Lemony Vegetables and Pasta

Yields: 7 servings

#### **Ingredients**

1 pound fresh asparagus, trimmed and cut into 1-inch pieces

1 medium sweet red pepper, cut into 1-inch pieces

1 medium red onion, sliced

1 tablespoon olive oil

1/2 teaspoon salt

1/4 teaspoon pepper

4-1/2 cups uncooked bow tie pasta

1 tablespoon butter

1 tablespoon all-purpose flour

3 garlic cloves, minced

1/4 teaspoon crushed red pepper flakes

1 cup vegetable broth

1 cup shredded Parmesan cheese



1/2 cup sour cream

2 tablespoons lemon juice

1 tablespoon grated lemon zest

1/2 cup chopped pistachios

1/4 cup fresh basil leaves, thinly sliced

Additional shredded Parmesan cheese

#### **Directions**

- 1. In a large bowl, combine the asparagus, red pepper, onion, oil, salt and pepper. Transfer to a greased 15x10x1-in. baking pan. Bake at 450° for 10-15 minutes or until golden brown, stirring once.
- 2. Meanwhile, cook pasta according to package directions. In a large saucepan, melt butter over medium heat. Stir in the flour, garlic and pepper flakes until blended. Whisk in broth until blended. Bring to a boil over medium-high heat; cook and stir for 2 minutes or until thickened and bubbly.
- Reduce heat. Stir in the cheese, sour cream, lemon juice and zest; heat through. Drain pasta and place in a large bowl. Add cheese sauce and asparagus mixture; toss to coat. Sprinkle with pistachios, basil and additional cheese.
