Mission Moment Update ... March 17, 2024—Family Promise



At our Mission Luncheon last Sunday, we had the opportunity to hear updated information from Katherine Adraktas at Family Promise of Greater Kingsport. Family

Promise offers various services to people of all ages who are facing financial challenges in staying housed. WRPC has worked for many years to assist with their shelter program. We learned that currently, instead of sheltering guest families at host churches or at a local motel, Family Promise has purchased property that provides a static shelter for their guests. The property consists of a small house and two smaller apartments. Waverly Road is joining with other local churches in a rotating schedule to supply dinners for the guest families in the shelter program.

Our first "hosting" week is April 7-13 during which we will provide and prepare dinner each of the 5 weeknights. Dinners will be delivered to the Family Promise Office at 601 Holston Street any time before 5 pm each day. Family Promise staff will then deliver the meals to each family at their shelter. WE ARE SEEKING VOLUNTEERS TO PARTICIPATE IN THIS DINNER MINISTRY. If you are interested for either our immediate hosting week or for a future rotation week, please let the church office know or contact Carlista Barttels (our WRPC/Family Promise representative) directly by phone or text at 253-227-0993.

As a dinner volunteer you will need to supply and prepare meals to be delivered for up to 3 families. We will know the exact numbers a few days in advance of our delivery week, but currently there are 2 families with a total of 2 adults and 3 children. As a volunteer, you can work alone or with partners. You can prepare and deliver home cooked meals, prepared frozen entrees, or ordered take-out meals. You can deliver individual meal servings or family-style servings. If you need delivery containers, I can provide those for you. We can work creatively together to facilitate your participation in any way that is optimal for you.




Stewardship reported that income for January and February ran slightly behind projections, but expenses did as well.



Godly Play: Lent Study of the VII Faces of Easter

Faces of Easter VI

Jesus went to Jerusalem for the last time. It was the time of the Passover,

and the city was full of people from many different lands. The people thought that he was coming to be king, but they were not paying attention. He was not riding a great white horse, with soldiers; he was riding a borrowed donkey. Still, the people waved palm branches as he came into Jerusalem which was a sign of

kings. On Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, Jesus went into the temple to teach. One day when he was there and old woman came into the temple and put the tiniest of all coins in the box. That was all the money she had. Then came a rich man with friends to help him carry the money and pour it clattering into the box. Jesus asked, "Now I wonder which one really gave the most?" That was how he taught. On Thursday evening of that week the Twelve hurried through the streets to a house where they shared their last supper together.

After supper, Jesus took some bread and gave thanks to God for it. Then he broke it and said something like, "Whenever you break the bread like this and share it, I will be there." He also took a cup of wine, gave thanks to God for it, and said, "Whenever you hare a cup of wine like this, I will be there." What was

he talking about? He was always saying things like that. Suddenly Judas got up and left. The rest went to the Garden of Gethsemane. Jesus wanted to pray. When he finished, he joined the rest, but Judas came out of the dark and greeted him. This was a signal for the temple guard to come out of the shadows and take Jesus away.

Faces of Easter VII

The night was a confusing one. The next day, Jesus was taken outside the city and crucified. That afternoon, Jesus died. The sky grew dark. Jesus was taken down from the cross and buried in a cave. A great stone was rolled into the opening of the cave to close it like a door.



Saturday was so quiet you could almost hear the earth breathing. On Sunday, it was the women who had the courage to go to the tomb just to be close to Jesus. They wanted to remember him, even if it felt sad. When they came to the tomb, they found that the stone had been rolled back and the tomb was empty. Jesus had died on the cross, but somehow he was still with them as he is with us, especially in the bread and the wine.

*When we remember that Jesus died on the cross for us, we also remember that he is still with us. That is the Mystery of Easter. It includes all the sadness and happiness that could ever be. That is why the mystery is so huge. —Wanda Kerns
