Many years ago, when I was in school, we were told to provide information about a subject, we should answer the questions "What, When, Why, Where, Who, and How?" I am going to follow that recommendation to talk about Stephen Ministry.

What is Stephen Ministry? It is a caring ministry which provides emotional and spiritual support to people going through times of transitions in life. It provides hope and healing in a caring, confidential, Christian way.

When does a person need a Stephen Minister? As you read this, do you know of a person who is going through a divorce, lost a loved one, has been given a difficult health diagnosis, has a new job or recently retired, recently moved to the area, or any other change in life? If so, that person could use a Stephen Minister.

Why would the person want a Stephen Minister? There are times in each of our lives when we feel that it would be nice to have someone to listen to us in a caring, non-judgmental way and keep our confidences.

Where do I find a Stephen Minister? Waverly Road is one of three churches in Kingsport which have Stephen Ministers. If someone prefers to talk with someone from another church, the person can be assigned a caregiver from one of the other churches.

Who is involved in Stephen Ministry? There are two types of people involved in Stephen Ministry. The care receiver is the person who is going through the time of transition. The care givers in our congregation are Scott Bowles, Tom Christian, Mark Crow, Susan Foster, Anne Garber, Barbara Lane, Dave Petke, Linda Qualls, Syliva Rotenberry, and Martha Triplett. The care receiver and care giver meet on a regular basis for as long as care is needed and desired.

How do I find out more about Stephen Ministry? Talk with one of the Stephen Ministers listed above. There is also information on the church website, pew cards in the pews, and additional articles about the ministry in the meditation room outside of Amy's office.

Our Stephen Ministers are here for you and your loved ones.

We Need Your Feedback on a New SALT Group!

The Adult Ministries Committee is exploring the possibility of forming a new SALT (Seeking and Learning Together) group that will focus on studying the Enneagram.

The Enneagram is an ancient personality typing system that identifies Nine Personality Types expressed individually and in relationship to others. One of the distinctions of the Enneagram is that it doesn't just explain how you are now, but it shows you how you can better move forward into the future.

Right now, the Enneagram is especially important because we are culturally so divided into tribes and camps and we are polarized, and we seem to be finding ourselves based on what we are against instead of centering on what we're for.

When we understand the nine different ways of seeing the world, we can give other people room to see the world the way they see it. And we can learn from that and bring different gifts to one another and try to address our future together.

Apprentice Class - Hybrid Format via Zoom and in-person in Room 105. Class begins at 9:15 instead of 9:45 to accommodate the logistics with Zoom. Leaders: Howard Carman, Dave and Sharon Petke. The Apprentice Class studies varying theological and biblical topics and perspectives to challenge "why we believe what we believe" and to gain knowledge and understanding of what it means to each of us to be apprentices of Jesus. Past studies have included books by Dallas Willard, James Bryan Smith, Henri Nouwen, John Ortberg, A.W. Tozer, Graham Standish, Richard Rohr, Andy Stanley, and others. Members of the class span the "spectrum" of experience, beliefs, theologies, and thoughts. The class members are an intimate group that lovingly welcomes each other's experiences and beliefs and respects perspectives different from our own. We accept that there is no "one way" for being an apprentice of Jesus and we help each other find our own "narrow path" of apprenticeship.
