WHO: Sam Naylor of Peter's Work, friend of the Petkes since 2007. Ministering in both St. Petersburg, Russia, and Lviv {luh-veev}, Ukraine.

## WHEN: Summer 2024

**WHAT**: \$400 to support Sports Camp for teens and young adults in Ukraine. Sam's work covers a lot of needs, but I asked for support for the summer camp because it would resonate with us and our mission to send children to Holston Presbytery Camp. Here is his report from last



year's inaugural camp: All the participants (teens and leaders) are displaced, and few have church backgrounds. The camp was held in a wooded area 30 miles from the Russian border. We drove five minivans for twelve hours to get there

from Lviv, hauling kids, staff, and equipment. We passed many villages with burned-out houses, stores, and schools and closed-off roads where landmines had not been cleared. Currently, this area is relatively quiet, as the missiles instead fly overhead on the way to Kyiv.

It was an opportunity to offer children a fun-filled week of respite in a beautiful area of nature and a chance to hear about Jesus. We organized and hosted it through one of the churches we work with in eastern Ukraine. We also invited young Ukrainian coaches from the Fellowship of Christian Athletes. The camp was held in a village school. The school principal canceled lessons for two days, *(Continued on back page)* 

# **Think Stephen Ministry**



Our Stephen Ministry belongs to every member of Waverly Road Presbyterian's congregation. It is your ministry, too, and we ask you to support it in whatever ways you can. One essential way you can help Stephen Ministry is to Think Stephen Ministry.

What does it mean to Think Stephen Ministry? It means remembering Stephen Ministry as you meet and talk to people. When you notice someone has a need, ask the person about it and listen. Ask yourself, "Might this be a need for Stephen Ministry?" As stated in a previous article, let yourself be the eyes and ears of Jesus. When Jesus saw a need, he recognized it and looked for a way to fill that need. This is an opportunity for Jesus to work through you so that you are quick to recognize needs and to find ways to fill those needs.

How do you recognize when needs exist? If a person you talk to each week at church isn't there one week, give them a call to be sure everything is all right. If someone you know at work or in your neighborhood begins to behave differently, take notice. Often people withdraw when a crisis occurs, or they may not have the energy or drive to let others know something is wrong. They may be embarrassed about needing help and try to cover up that need. That's why it's important for all of us in our church — not just the Pastor, Elders, Stephen Leaders, and Stephen Ministers — to recognize our responsibility to look out for one another. You may make a big difference for people by noticing their need and getting them connected with Stephen Ministry.

Thinking Stephen Ministry is having your antennae up so that you are aware of the needs around you and always looking for ways to meet those needs, whether through Stephen Ministry or another appropriate type of care.

saying, "Our children can learn math any day, but it's not every day athletic coaches come to share about Jesus."

I'll admit my expectations for the camp were low, but I can now say it was the best

camp I've ever attended. We were blessed with good weather, great staff, enthusiastic campers, safety, and protection. We had registered and planned for 50 children to

attend, but 62 showed up. (200 children have expressed an interest in attending camp in 2024.) We were somewhat surprised that so many parents were ready to send their children away to camp during a war. But a common answer is, "Our kids are not safe in their beds. Schools and hospitals are targets\*. So why wouldn't we send them to camp and try to give them a fun summer experience and some hope?" Testimonies from two of the campers:

 "I was given my own Bible to keep. We read it together daily, and I prayed to God with my team." ~ Maria, a 15-year-old Bible before
