*AFFIRMATION OF FAITH

N OF FAITH (from A Declaration of Faith of the Presbyterian Church (U.S.A.) and The Shorter Catechism)

God bound his people to himself in covenant. Freed slaves became the people of God when they accepted the Lord's covenant.
