

## Dr. Malcolm McKinley Jones, Jr.



Dr. Malcolm McKinley Jones, Jr., 97, of Kingsport, passed away peacefully on May 31, 2024. He resided in Kingsport with his wife of 69 years, Marie Hewitt Jones, until her passing last August. Malcolm grew up in the Elizabethton area and was drafted into the U.S. Army Air Forces where he served from July 1945 to January 1947.

He graduated from East Tennessee State College in Johnson City before receiving his medical degree at the University of Tennessee in Memphis. He was a practicing physician in Kingsport for more than 30 years. He faithfully attended Waverly Road Presbyterian Church.
