One of our members has developed cutwork banners to hang in our sanctuary windows to enhance Bible passages throughout the year, especially during Lent.

Lenten Window Banners



The original Lenten Window Banners were first created in 2000. We knew so little, but fumbled, laughed, listened to opera, practically cried in frustration several times when things went wrong, and were on a VERY steep and fast learning curve as we explored this new art form we grew to love. We treasure those memories, and miss our friend Miklos Bus, who passed away in 2013, each year as we make and hang up the banners.

The banners are made from original designs drawn on photographic background paper and cut with an Exact-o knife. The first two banners go up on Ash Wednesday. Then each Sunday for six weeks,

another is added that coordinates with the theme of the sermon. During Holy Week, the last two banners go up for Maundy Thursday and, Good Friday. As each Sunday passes,

and we get closer and closer to Good Friday, the sanctuary gets darker and darker. Remember that Christ knew what lay ahead for him. He kept telling the disciples, who did not want to believe it. But Christ led them on toward Jerusalem, still teaching them, healing, encouraging, and loving them all the way.

It is our hope and prayer that viewing these banners will enhance your appreciation of how much God loves you, and the enormity of what Christ did for us all.
